Intellectual property refers to creation of the mind, such as inventions, literary and artistic works, designs and symbols, names and images. IPR are the rights given to person over the intellectual creativity.

Intellectual Property Right (IPR) is intangible in nature, indivisible and any number of people can consume an intellectual good without being depleted. IPR includes patents, copyright, trademarks, *etc.* IPR is a legal concept for the recognition and protection of rights of the exclusively creative minds. It is an asset with rights that the owner can prevent unauthorized use or sale of property.

Similar to the conventional property, intellectual property can be sold, bought, licensed or exchanged. Intangible assets include literary, music and artistic works, discoveries and inventions, words and phrases, symbols and designs. Intellectual creativity is protected as it's a prerequisite for better identification, planning, creativity and discovery.

OBJECTIVE:

To grant incentive for the intellectual creativity and innovation, that leads to technological advancement, development and economic welfares of Priyadarshini Dental College & Hospital.

NEED FOR IPR:

Any creation is involved with enormous effect, time and energy. Few projects involve even large investment. Thus, the creative inventions of the creator have to be recognized and protected, emphasizing the need for IPR.

Priyadarshini Dental College and Hospital (PDCH) supports and encourages the students and faculty for the innovations and protects the intellectual rights through filing of patent, copyright, etc. Innovations are identified, promoted and protected by applying to IPR through proper channels within the framework of the administrators of PDCH. The college recognizes the IPR owner for their time, effort and money involved in the creation and honors them with the token of appreciation, there by promoting young minds for more creativity and innovations.

KINDS OF IPR:

PATENTS:

The patent right gives the legal protection for inventions for a period of twenty years until it reaches commercialization or rights to sell or use or distribute and can be done only with the concern of the patent owner. The protection prevents others from using, selling or making an invention for a period of twenty years. The patent right after twenty years enters the public domain and can no longer be claimed by patent owner. The basis on which patentability lies is novelty, inventive step and industrial applicability. PDCH encourages the faculty and students to file their innovations for patent, support and guide them to file a patent.

COPY RIGHTS:

Copyright is a right to create to print, publish and sell copies or translate his/her original work like poem, novel, dramatic and music like composition, choreography and artistic works like

painting, drawing, sculpture, architecture, photography, advertisement. Copyright provides economic right to the creator with financial benefits that last for fifty years even after the demise of the creator. PDCH encourages the faculty and students to file copyright with relevance to the unique slogan, logo, etc., made by them.

PDCH familiarizes students and faculty with IPR. Periodical seminar, workshop is conducted to update the knowledge about IPR. It provides a conducive environment to inculcate research culture and encourage faculty and students which may result in intellectual property by way of providing adequate infrastructure and financial help. It will support to obtain patent, copyrights, filing of patency in Intellectual Property India.

PDCH engages the patent attorney to help student and faculty apply and follow up IPR till it is granted. PDCH bears the entire cost from the application till it is granted. At the time of commercialization, 60% of the income will belong to the inventor and 40% will belong to PDCH.

REGISTERING IPR:

- 1. Fill the application form by the applicant and the agent.
- 2. A statement by the applicant explaining the uniqueness of the invention to be attached.

- 3. After the examiner evaluation, any deficiencies are to be corrected and submitted within a period of one month.
- 4. Group of examiners will assess the accuracy, validity and then issue an examination report.
- 5. Any objection or issue raised by registrar will be commutated with a show-cause notice.
- 6. When the registrar approves and accept, the application gets published in IPR journal within the three months.
- 7. Any person having any objection to the application or another inventor with a similar product must submit the opposition notice within three months. In that case, counterstatement has to be given to the registrar within two months. If failed to submit it becomes forfeited application.
- 8. Once the IPR application is accepted, a seal stating the rightful owner of the IPR is received by the applicant.
