RESEARCH COLLABORATION REPORT - 28.6.2023

As a part of research collaboration, Dr. V. Vasanth Ayswarya, Priyadarshini dental college and hospital had collaborated work of a research topic titled "EVALUATION OF TEMPERATURE IN DIFFERENT INTRA-ORAL SITES" with Vellore Institute of Technology, Chennai. The project had collaborative efforts from both institutions, fostering research culture and exposure to varied set up in research. The study was proposed by Dr. B. Sivapathasundharam, and the Department Of Periodontics, Priyadarshini Dental College And Hospital. The study had the following aim and methodology. Thermal camera was utilized from Vellore Institute of Technology, Chennai.

OBJECTIVES:

To determine the oral temperature in various intra-oral sites using thermal camera, assess its correlation with body temperature, and evaluate the association of temperature with inflammation in the oral cavity.

MATERIALS AND METHODS:

A total of systemically healthy 25 subjects were recruited from the outpatient department of periodontology, Priyadarshini dental college and hospital for the study. Subjects were assessed for the temperature using thermal imaging camera in different intraoral sites - Floor of the mouth, buccal mucosa, hard palate, soft palate, gingival sulcus and attached gingiva. The collected data were statistically analyzed.

RESULTS:

The coldest site is teeth while the hottest site is carious teeth. Attached gingiva shows temperature in Periodontitis(P) > Gingivitis(G) > Healthy(H) periodontium attributing to the fact increased inflammation leads to rise in temperature. It was also seen that body temperature has no significant difference between any intra oral site. Gingival inflammation showed significant difference between H & G, H & P.

CONCLUSION:

Thermal camera is a reliable instrument to assess intraoral temperature. Intra oral temperature assessment is a reliable method to assess body temperature. Attached gingiva and carious tooth has inflammation that may show variation of increase in temperature from the other sites.

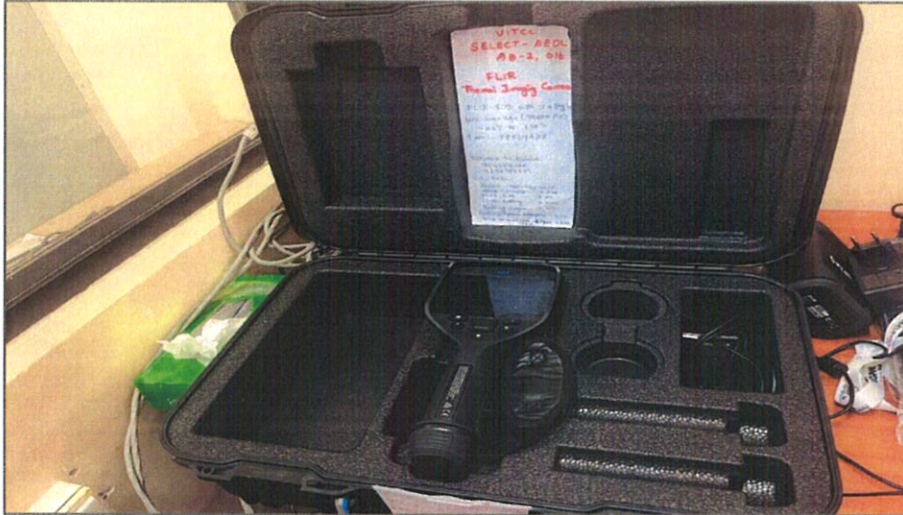

RESEARCH COLLABORATION REPORT – 30.6.2023

A research collaboration was done between Priyadarshini dental college and hospital and Vpet Genetic lab, Chennai. A research project titled “ASSESSMENT OF CYTOGENIC DAMAGE IN CHRONIC PERIODONTITIS AND TYPE 2 DIABETES MELLITUS SUBJECTS THROUGH MICRONUCLEUS TEST” was done by Dr. V. Vasanth Ayswarya, Dr. Paavai, Ms. Akshaya. M, Department of Periodontics at the Vpet Genetic lab. It is an ongoing study since March 2023 with the following study details.

OBJECTIVE

1. To assess the cytogenic damage (through micronuclear frequency - MNF), in gingival cells of health, periodontitis and diabetes subjects
2. To evaluate the correlation of cytogenic damage in periodontitis and type 2 diabetes mellitus.

METHODOLOGY

The study evaluated the cytogenic damage (MNF) in chronic periodontitis subjects and its correlation with diabetes. A total of 20 subjects was categorized to four groups, from the outpatient department of periodontics in Priyadarshini dental college and hospital, Thiruvallur district shall be included in the study. A thorough case history shall be taken and their complete periodontal examination, a sample of 2ml venous blood was collected from each subject to evaluate the glycated haemoglobin levels (HbA1C) and random plasma glucose levels (FPG). Swab of epithelial cells from mucosa and gingiva were collected and evaluated for cytogenic damage after staining the slide. Genetic evaluation was done in Vpet Genetic lab.

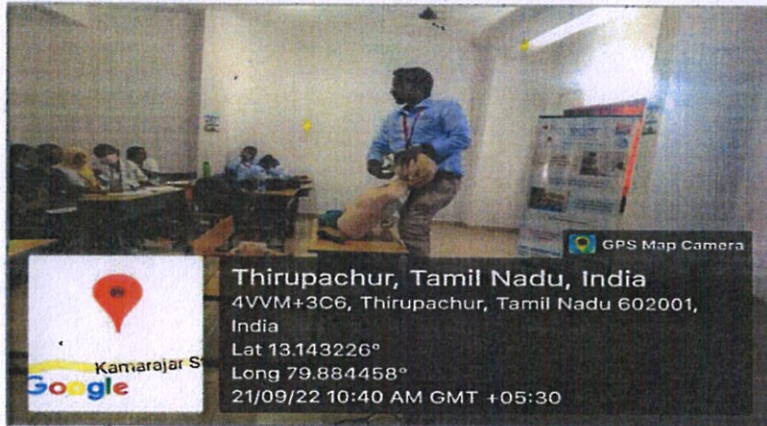
REPORT

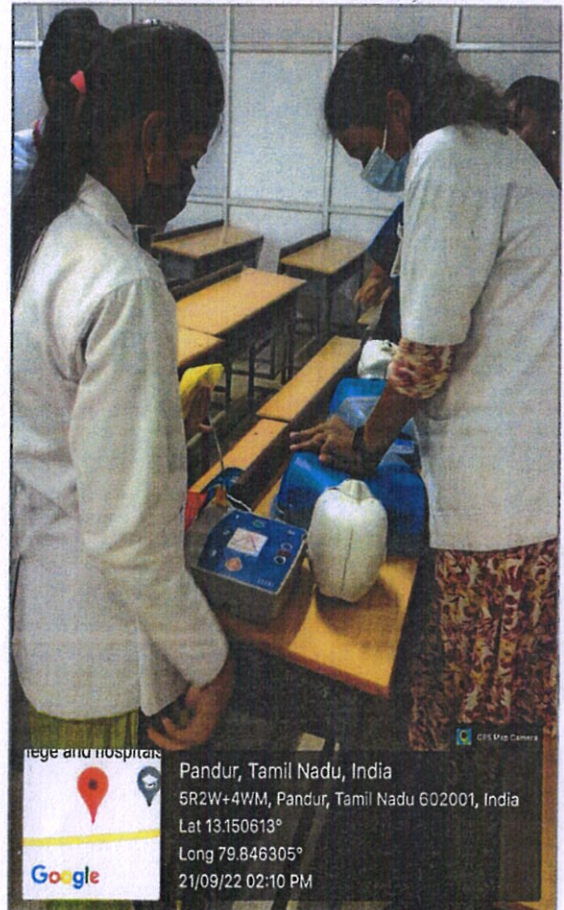
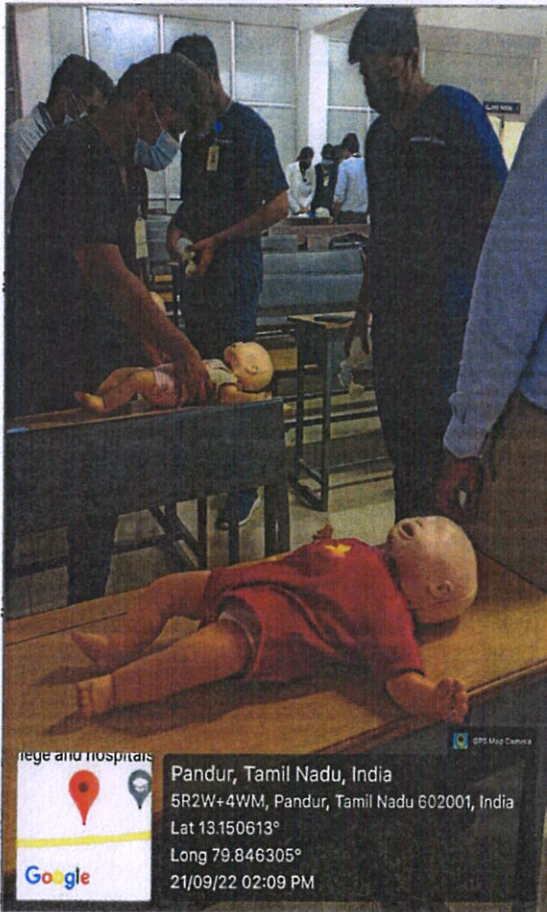

As a part of research collaboration, Dr. I. Paavai, Professor and Head Department of Periodontics, Priyadarshini dental college and hospital had collaborated work of a research topic titled "Evaluation of serum and salivary PCSK9 and IL6 and its association with periodontal inflammation and atherosclerotic cardiovascular diseases" with SRM dental college and Hospital. The project had collaborative efforts from both institutions fostering research culture and exposure to varied set up in research. The procedure and evaluation were done SRM dental college and Hospital, Ramapuram. The study was done in the period of 2021-2022. The study was proposed by Dr. I. Paavai, Professor and Head, Department of Periodontics, Priyadarshini Dental College and Hospital, and collaborated with Dr. Roshan, Dr. Priyanka, Dr. Victor, Dr. Sanjay and Dr. Anupama.

The study had the following aim, methodology, results and conclusion.

Aim: The aim of this study was to assess, compare and correlate the ability of PCSK9 and IL6 as potential common serum and salivary biomarkers for stage III/IV periodontitis and the risk of developing atherosclerotic cardiovascular disease.

Methods: 76 patients were allotted into 4 groups consisting of subjects with clinically healthy periodontium and stage III/IV periodontitis with and without ACVD. Clinical parameters - PD, CAL, number of teeth, PI, mSBI, TC, Tg, HDL and LDL were recorded. Serum and saliva samples were obtained and subjected to ELISA for quantifying the biomarker levels.

The clinical parameters PI, mSBI, PPD, CAL, total number of teeth, TC, HDL and LDL showed a significant correlation with biomarkers PCSK9 and IL6.

Conclusion: This study features the elevation of serum and salivary PCSK9 and IL6 in periodontitis and ACVD. A triad of serum and salivary PCSK9 and IL6 along with the clinical markers of periodontal disease can relatively predict the future risk of developing ACV.

Paavai, Professor and Head, Department of Periodontics, Priyadarshini dental college and hospital had worked on a research topic titled "Evaluation of serum and salivary PCSK9 and IL6 and its association with periodontal inflammation and atherosclerotic cardiovascular diseases" with Frontier Lifeline Hospital. The project had collaborative efforts from both institution and Frontier Lifeline Hospital, fostering research culture and exposure to varied set up in research. The sample collection was done in Frontier Lifeline Hospital. The study was done in the period of 2021-2022. The study was proposed by Dr. I. Paavai, Professor and Head, Department of Periodontics, Priyadarshini Dental College and Hospital, and collaborated with Dr. Roshan, Dr. Priyanka, Dr. Victor, Dr. Sanjay and Dr. Anupama.

The aim of this study was to assess, compare and correlate the ability of PCSK9 and IL6 as potential common serum and salivary biomarkers for stage III/IV periodontitis and the risk of developing atherosclerotic cardiovascular disease. 76 patients were allotted into 4 groups consisting of subjects with clinically healthy periodontium and stage III/IV periodontitis with and without ACVD. Clinical parameters - PD, CAL, number of teeth, PI, mSBI, TC, Tg, HDL and LDL were recorded. Serum and saliva samples were obtained and subjected to ELISA for quantifying the biomarker levels. The project had collaborative efforts from both institution and Hospital fostering research culture and exposure to varied set up in research. The procedure and evaluation were done in Frontier Lifeline Hospital. The study was done in the period of 2021-2022. The study was proposed by Dr. I. Paavai, Professor and Head, Department of Periodontics, Priyadarshini Dental College and Hospital, and collaborated with Dr. Jaideep Mahendra, Dr. Sruthi Srinivasan, Dr. Anilkumar, Dr. Nalini, Dr. Ambalavanan, Dr. Little Mahendra, Dr. Janani and Dr. Sanjay M Cherian.

The study was done to determine the expression of trefoil factor 2 (TFF2), trefoil factor 3 (TFF3), and adrenomedullin (ADM) in salivary samples of periodontitis patients with and without coronary heart disease (CHD). A total of 75 patients were selected based on the inclusion and exclusion criteria and divided into three groups of 25 patients each: generalized periodontitis (GP) only; GP+CHD; and CHD only. Demographic, periodontal, and cardiac parameters were recorded, and unstimulated saliva samples were collected and analyzed for the expression of TFF2, TFF3, and ADM. Among the demographic variables, the means for age, weight, and body mass index were significantly different between the groups on statistical analysis. Plaque index, bleeding on probing, probing pocket depth, clinical attachment level, and the expression of TFF2 were highest in the GP+CHD group, and ADM was highest in the CHD group, with P values of < 0.01 as compared to the other groups. As a part of research collaboration, Dr. I. Paavai, Professor and Head, Department of Periodontics, Priyadarshini dental college and Hospital worked on a research topic titled “Covid 19 Susceptibility among ABO/RH blood groups in tamilnadu population—A retrospective case control study” with Frontier Lifeline Hospital. The project had collaborative efforts from both institution and hospital fostering research culture and exposure to varied set up in research. The procedure and evaluation were done in Frontier Lifeline Hospital. The study was done in the period of 2020-2021. The study was proposed from the Department of Periodontics, Priyadarshini dental college and hospital under the guidance of Dr. I. Paavai, , Dr.Ayswarya V Vummidi, Dr.Abirami T , and collaborated with Sanjay M Cherian ,Consultant Cardiac Surgeon, Department of Cardiac Surgery, Dr.K.M.Cherian’s Frontier Lifeline Hospital, Chennai, Dr.Arulpari Mahalingam, MDS., Professor, Department of Pedodontics, Thai Moogambigai Dental College and Hospital, Dr.Vineela Katam Reddy, Professor, Department of Periodontology, Indira Gandhi Institute of Dental Sciences.

The study had the aim to analyse the potential susceptibility of Covid - 19 among the blood groups (ABO and Rh type) in Tamil Nadu population. A non-interventional retrospective case control study with 500 patients who tested positive for COVID-19 were taken as the “cases”, while another 500, who tested negative were taken as the “control”. The medical records including the blood group and Rh factor, were collected from Government recognised testing centres (Government medical hospital and Primary health centers, Tiruvallur and Frontier lifeline hospital, Chennai) in Tamil Nadu, whocame for Covid - 19 screening by Reverse Transcriptase Polymerase Chain Reaction (RT-PCR). The data was analysed to associate its correlation with

different blood groups. The blood group A was shown significantly higher distribution among the cases ($p = 0.030$) and the blood groups O and B were significant among the controls ($p = 0.026$ and 0.000 respectively). Blood group AB did not show any significant differences between the groups ($p = 0.374$). The Odd's ratio for AB, A, O and B group for Rh (positive and negative) were shown to be 0.659, 0.591, 0.472 and 0.262 respectively suggesting increased susceptibility towards Rh positive factor. In the current study, the blood group A was found to be the more susceptible and blood group O to be the least susceptible to Covid - 19 in Tamil Nadu population. Additionally, Rh positive factor showed more inclination towards Covid susceptibility than Rh negative factor. ABO blood group may be considered as a potential non-modifiable and secondary risk factor for Covid - 19 contributing to the disease pathobiology at immunological, biochemical and physiological levels. Still, the intensity of their role and their exact mechanism in its association requires further exploration to validate the current findings.

The project had collaborative efforts from both Hospital, promote research culture and exposure to varied set up in research. The study was proposed by Dr. I. Paavai, and collaborated with Ayswarya V Vummidi, Abirami Thanigaimalai, Pavithra H, Little Mahendra., Little Mahendra Sanjay M. Cherian, Jaideep Mahendra, Vasugi Suresh, Arulpari Mahalingam. The study include subgingival and atherosclerotic plaque samples and both the samples were collected only from frontier lifeline hospital.

The study was done to evaluate the association of pentraxin in patients with concomitant periodontitis and CAD. In a case-control study, 240 participants were selected and divided into 4 groups. Non-periodontitis + non-cardiac (NP+NC) = 60 patients, periodontitis + non-cardiac (P+NC) = 60 patients, non-periodontitis + cardiac (NP+C) = 60 patients, periodontitis + cardiac (P+C) = 60 patients. Demographic variables, cardiac and periodontal parameters were recorded. Pentraxin was evaluated in the sub- gingival plaque and atheromatous plaque samples using Real time quantitative polymerase chain reaction (q-PCR) and compared between the groups. The results were statistically analysed. Among the demographic variables, age showed a significant difference between the groups. Systolic and diastolic blood pressure, low density lipoprotein and random blood sugar were significantly higher in NP+C and P+C groups ($p \leq 0.05$). The plaque index, probing pocket depth and clinical attachment loss were significantly higher in P+NC and P+C groups ($p \leq 0.05$). Pentraxin was significantly elevated in P+C group (p -value=0.000). Pearson’s correlation revealed significant correlation between the periodontal parameters and pentraxin in both the cardiac and oral samples. CONCLUSION: PTX3 levels were elevated in coronary artery disease patients with periodontitis suggesting the influence of periodontal inflammation in the progression of CAD. PTX3 may serve as a

OBJECTIVES: Evaluating the prevalence of Epstein-Barr virus (EBV), cytomegalovirus (CMV), and herpes simplex virus (HSV) in periodontitis and/or coronary artery disease (CAD) patients to compare with their healthy controls and insist their significance in the same.

METHODOLOGY: 240 patients were divided into 4 groups. Non-periodontitis+non-cardiac (NP+NC), periodontitis+non-cardiac patients (P+NC), non-periodontitis+cardiac patients (NP+C), and periodontitis+cardiac (P+C). Each group 60 patients. Demographic variables, cardiac and periodontal parameters were recorded. EBV, CMV, and HSV were evaluated in the subgingival plaque samples using RT-PCR. Did Student's t-test, Pearson's chi-square, Turkey post hoc analysis, and multiple logistic regression analysis.

RESULTS: The demographic variables did not differ significantly between the groups, except for age. SBP, DBP, low-density lipoprotein, and RBS were significantly higher in NP+C and P+C. The PI, PPD, and CAL were significantly higher in P+NC and P+C. EBV and CMV were significantly higher in the two periodontitis groups P+NC and P+C. HSV was significantly higher in the two cardiac groups (NP+C and P+C).

CONCLUSION: The study concluded that higher prevalence of EBV and CMV was found in groups with periodontitis patients. This indicates the significant role of the viruses in

The study titled “Evaluation of pentraxins in periodontitis patients associated with cardiovascular diseases” was done by Dr. Paavai. I, Professor, Department of Periodontics during the period of 2019-20. The molecular analysis of this study was done in Tamilnadu Veterinary and Animal science University, Vepery, Chennai (TANUVAS).

The study included subgingival and atherosclerotic plaque samples (coronary artery bypass graft surgery) which were processed using q-PCR (Real time quantitative polymerase chain reaction) for the detection of Pentraxin-3. Total cellular RNA was extracted from tissue samples using Trizol reagent. Relative levels of pentraxin mRNA were assessed by qPCR employing SYBR green. The primers for pentraxin-3 were designed in genomic position of 5806. (Forward primer: CGAAATAGACAATGGACTCCATCC, Reverse primer: CTCATCTGCGAGTTCTCCAGCA).

RESEARCH COLLABORATION REPORT – 18.6.2019

As a part of research collaboration, Ms. Vanessa Ravel, CRI, Priyadarshini dental college and hospital had collaborated work of a research topic titled “Evaluation of anti-bacterial activity of lemongrass oil against oral clinical isolates – an invitro study” with Saveetha Dental College and Hospital. The project had collaborative efforts from both institutions, fostering research culture and exposure to varied set up in research. The in-vitro procedure and evaluation were done in Saveetha Dental College and Hospital. The study was done in the period of April to June 2019.

The study was proposed from the Department Of Periodontics, Priyadarshini Dental College And Hospital under the guidance of Dr. I. Paavai, Dr. V. Vasanth Ayswarya, Dr. Veejai Chandran and collaborated with Dr. P. Muralidharan, Professor, Department of Microbiology in Saveetha Dental College And Hospital. The study had the following aim and methodology.

Aim: To comparatively evaluate the antibacterial activity of lemongrass essential oil with tetracycline against *Streptococcus mutans*, *Staphylococcus epidermidis* and *Lactobacillus* and to determine the minimal inhibitory concentration of lemongrass essential oil.

Method: It is an *in vitro* study done to demonstrate the antimicrobial activity of lemongrass against the oral microbes. Based on their involvement in various clinical conditions Streptococcus mutants, Staphylococcus epidermis and Lactobacillus were selected for the study. These organisms were inoculated to a solid media and incubated overnight aerobically at 37°C to obtain a pure culture. The culture was made as a suspension in sterile saline with the turbidity matching 0.5 Macfarland standard. This is used to make a lawn culture on the Mueller Hinton Agar. Antimicrobial effect of tetracycline was tested using standard disc of doxycycline 30 mcg (Himedia, SD012) and sterile disc was used to prepare lemongrass essential oil which contained 10 µl, 15 µl and 20µl. In each category 5 discs were tested to get a mean zone of inhibition. After 24 hours of incubation the zone of inhibition was measure in mm using a scale. The measured zone size was tabulated and compared among the groups.

Expected outcome: The antibacterial activity of lemongrass essential oil may be better than tetracycline against *Streptococcus mutans*, *Staphylococcus epidermidis* and *Lactobacillus*

The study titled “Evaluation of periodontal viruses in periodontitis patients associated with cardiovascular diseases” was done by Dr. Paavai. I, Reader, Department of Periodontics during the period of 2018-19. The molecular analysis of this study was done in Tamilnadu Veterinary and Animal science University, Vepery, Chennai (TANUVAS). The study included RT-PCR analysis (Reverse transcriptase polymerase chain reaction) to synthesize cDNA (template) and to detect the presence of periodontal viruses. Total cellular RNA was extracted from tissue samples using Trizol reagent. The cDNA was synthesized from the extracted RNA using a cDNA synthesis kit. Primers for EBV were designed in the BNLF2b gene region (GenBank: AP015016.1) encompassing the genome position from 167796 to 167500 (Forward primer: GAACAAGGCCAAGAAGGA, Reverse primer: CAGGGACAACAGGTCAAA). Primers for CMV were designed in the RL1 gene region (GenBank: AY446894.2) encompassing the genome position from 1367-2299 (Forward primer: GGACCAACACACGTTACC, Reverse primer: CC TCGCCTATGTTGTGAAG). Primers for HSV were designed based on literature evidence. Agarose gel electrophoresis was done and the documentation of the gel image was done.
